## RUSSIA

### Dmitry Ivanovich, 1604-1606

- 1067 Medallion Rouble ND. 46 mm. Mid 1700's mint production. Reichel 570. Draped bust r., scepter over shoulder / Crowned Imperial eagle, shield on breast. Typical reverse die break from the crown to the right margin. Deep old collection toning over much mint lustre. Certified and graded by NGC MS 63 *Rare* thus Brilliant uncirculated \$ 3,750

### Mikhail Feodorovich, 1613-1645

- 1068 ¼ Ducat, ND. Novodel. 0.87 gm. GOLD. Fr 34, Shubert 38. This issue is a mule of the original obverse die and later novodel die of the late 1700's. Double-headed eagle / Five-line legend. *Rare* Certified and graded by NGC MS 62 Uncirculated \$ 1,500

### Alexei Mikhailovich, 1645-1676

- 1069 Jefimok Rouble 3P30 (1654). Novodel. 27.46 gm. Reichel 715, Zander, pl.9. Tsar on horseback r., scepter over his shoulder / State emblem. Cyrillic date 7162 (year of the World). A popular novodel of Russia's first western style crown. *Rare*. Small edge ding. Attractively toned over prooflike surfaces Extremely fine \$ 1,250

### Sophia as Regent for Ivan V and Peter I, 1682-1689

- 1070 ¾ Ducat, ND. Novodel. GOLD. (2.14 gm.). Fr 59, Kaim 1859. Facing busts of Ivan V and Peter, double-headed eagle above / Sophia facing holding scepter. *Rare* Certified and graded by NGC MS 62 Choice uncirculated \$ 2,500

### Ivan V, co-ruler with Peter I, 1682-1689

- 1071 1 Gold Kopeck, ND. Novodel. GOLD. Fr 74. Tsar on horseback / legend. *Rare*. Full mint lustre Certified and graded by NGC MS 65 Choice uncirculated \$ 1,750
- 1072 'Chech of Sevsk' 1686. Billon. 0.89 gm. Sev 9 (RRRR), Diakov p.24, Sp fig. 97, Ryabtsevich. Triple-crowned double-headed eagle, Latin initials around / Orb within beaded border, date and Latin legend around. Holed, otherwise very nice and choice. Unusually high-grade silver for the issue Extremely fine \$ 750

### Peter I, 1689-1725

- 1073 1 Gold Kopeck (of the weight of a Half Ducat), ND. Novodel. GOLD. (1.68 gm). Fr 75, Schubert (1843) 1047, Sev 4 (in silver). Horseman with spear right, ПѠСІА between legs / Six-line legend. *Very rare* Certified and graded by NGC AU 55 About uncirculated \$ 2,000
